OshawaLibrary.on.ca is your gateway to thousands of e-journals containing millions of articles from hundreds of different publishers. Go to www.OshawaLibrary.on.ca, then click on Information & Research and then Databases.

Choose a database, then find a specific article or journal, find articles that cover a specific topic, or browse a list of subject categories, all in one easy location. Here is a selection of databases available for searching Autism:

EBSCOhost Research Databases:

- MasterFILE Premier: This multidisciplinary database is designed for public libraries and provides full text for nearly 2,000 general reference publications with full-text information dating as far back as 1975.
- Health Source—Consumer Edition: This database is the richest collection of consumer health information available to libraries worldwide, providing information on many health topics including the medical sciences, food sciences and nutrition, childcare, sports medicine, and general health.
- Alternative Health Watch: This database focuses on the many perspectives of complementary, holistic and integrated approaches to health care and wellness. It offers libraries full-text articles for nearly 180 international and often peer-reviewed journals and reports.

Thomson Gale Databases:

- Health & Wellness Resource Center: This database provides instant access to carefully compiled and trusted medical reference materials. In partnership with Harvard Health, the database includes nearly 400 health/medical journals, numerous reference volumes, and over 700 health videos.
- Psychology Collection: This collection gives individuals a basic understanding of the study of the mind, emotions and how the human mind develops over time. Access to 200 subject-appropriate full-text periodicals.
